Continuing education is paramount for maintaining and expanding the superlative skill set our OBHG hospitalists bring to their programs. The **OBHG Risk Management, Quality, and Compliance Department** is responsible for ensuring that all providers complete required training before their effective start date and within specified periods after their first shift worked.

This required coursework includes comprehensive training on **National Quality Forum (NQF), Hospital Consumer Assessment of Healthcare Providers and Systems (HCAHPS), March of Dimes Preterm Labor Assessment Toolkit (PLAT), and EMTALA and HIPAA compliance training.**

Additionally, OBHG utilizes the **GNOSIS™ for OB** platform through Advanced Practice Strategies to ensure standardization among our clinical teams. Certain coursework within **GNOSIS™ for OB**, such as Fetal Assessment and Monitoring, must be completed prior to a provider's first


shift, with remaining coursework to be completed within 90 days. **GNOSIS™ for OB** specializes in individual learning pathways for key areas of OB/GYN risk, which results in improved clinical outcomes and reduced risk

ONE PLATFORM 4 ways to improve clinical outcomes

How does GNOSIS work? To begin, for each course, clinicians complete an individual **assessment** to measure their competency in both **knowledge and judgment**. Fetal Assessment and Monitoring

Focus: A tracing-centered approach to teach advanced concepts of fetal assessment and monitoring. Topics include anatomy and physiology, pattern identification, NICHD nomenclature, FHR components, patterns, interventions, pattern management, etc.

8. Assess knowledge of appropriate risk management practices

Shoulder Dystocia

Focus: A team-based model optimized for high-risk environments where collaboration is imperative. Content covers how to manage various aspects of shoulder dystocia (SD) with illustrations and explanations of the maneuvers used to resolve this obstetric emergency.



Learning Outcomes:

1. Appropriate documentation for an SD event
2. Identify common maneuvers used for delivery management
3. Understand and explain the importance of training and teamwork
4. Identify potential outcomes of SD
5. Identify recognized risk factors for SD
6. Define and describe the mechanics of SD

Obstetrical Hemorrhage

Focus: An overview of tools, guidelines, and approaches for managing obstetrical hemorrhage (OH). Content covers how to recognize abnormal bleeding, quantify blood loss, and identify common risk factors, plus how to understand early interventions.



Learning Outcomes:

1. Understand the role of maternal physiology in OH
2. Demonstrate knowledge and skill in blood loss determination
3. Recognize how to assess risk, prevent, and prepare for an OH event
4. Demonstrate knowledge of blood component options & resuscitation and transfusion guidelines
5. Recognize when to utilize medical options to manage OH
6. Understand when and how to utilize pre-surgical interventions

assessment: 45 minutes

Hypertensive Disorders in Pregnancy

Focus: A comprehensive update of 2013 CMQCC and ACOG evidence-based guidelines around the diagnosis and management of hypertensive disorders in pregnancy (HDP). Content covers classification & nomenclature; diagnostic criteria; and management guidelines.



Learning Outcomes:

1. Recognize ACOG updated nomenclature and diagnostic criteria guidelines
2. Understand which patients are at risk for HDP
3. Apply risk awareness and progressive nature of disease towards early recognition and mitigation of disease
4. Understand and apply the correct diagnostic criteria for HDP
5. Apply best practices for blood pressure measurement and management in pregnancy
6. Correctly interpret data to diagnose complex or atypical patient presentations
7. Understand and apply practice guidelines in management of patients with HDP
8. Recognize which patients can be expectantly managed versus those that should be delivered immediately
